Towards National Child Employment Laws?

Professor Andrew Stewart will review what we know about the work young Australians perform, outline the fragmented and sometimes conflicting systems of laws and processes that currently regulate such work, and explore the potential for a new, national approach to regulation.

Andrew Stewart is the John Bray Professor of Law at the University of Adelaide and a consultant to the national law firm Piper Alderman. One of Australia's leading experts in employment law and workplace relations, he has played a prominent role in the public debate over workplace reforms, and has spoken and written widely about their implications for businesses, workers and unions. Andrew's recent projects include advising the federal government on the drafting and structure of its new workplace legislation, and writing a report for the NSW Commission for Children and Young People on the development of national child employment laws. His most recent book is *Stewart's Guide to Employment Law*, published by Federation Press.
