Sex, Lies and Unfair Dismissal: The *Telstra* Case

The Full Bench of the Australian Industrial Relations Commission recently handed down its decision in *Telstra v Streeter* [2008] AIRCFB 15. Both this decision and the ruling at first instance of Hamberger SDP attracted considerable attention in the profession and also in the national media. *Telstra v Streeter* raises interesting and difficult questions about the scope of the employment relationship, employees' obligations to their employer for their conduct out of working hours, and the rights and duties of employers to oversee their employees' conduct. This seminar will provide an inside perspective on some of the key features of the case and the AIRC decisions, and will consider them in light of broader developments in the law relating to unfair dismissal.
